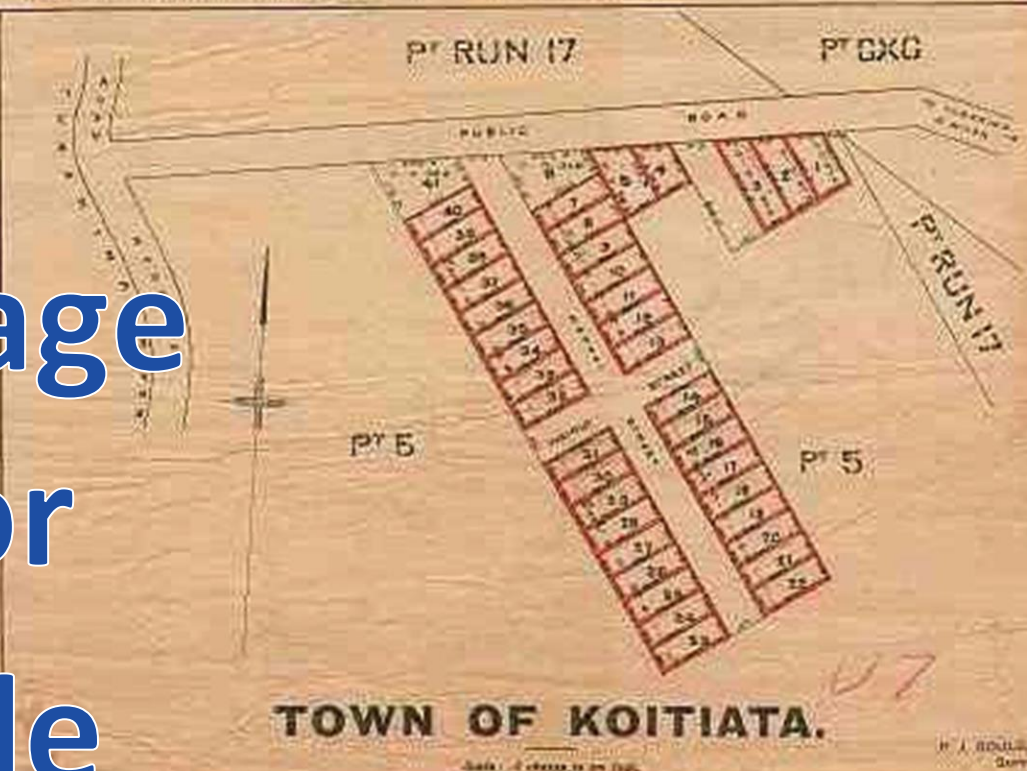

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## Village For Sale

The village's site had been chosen, sections were surveyed, and then 39 sections were auctioned in February 1919.

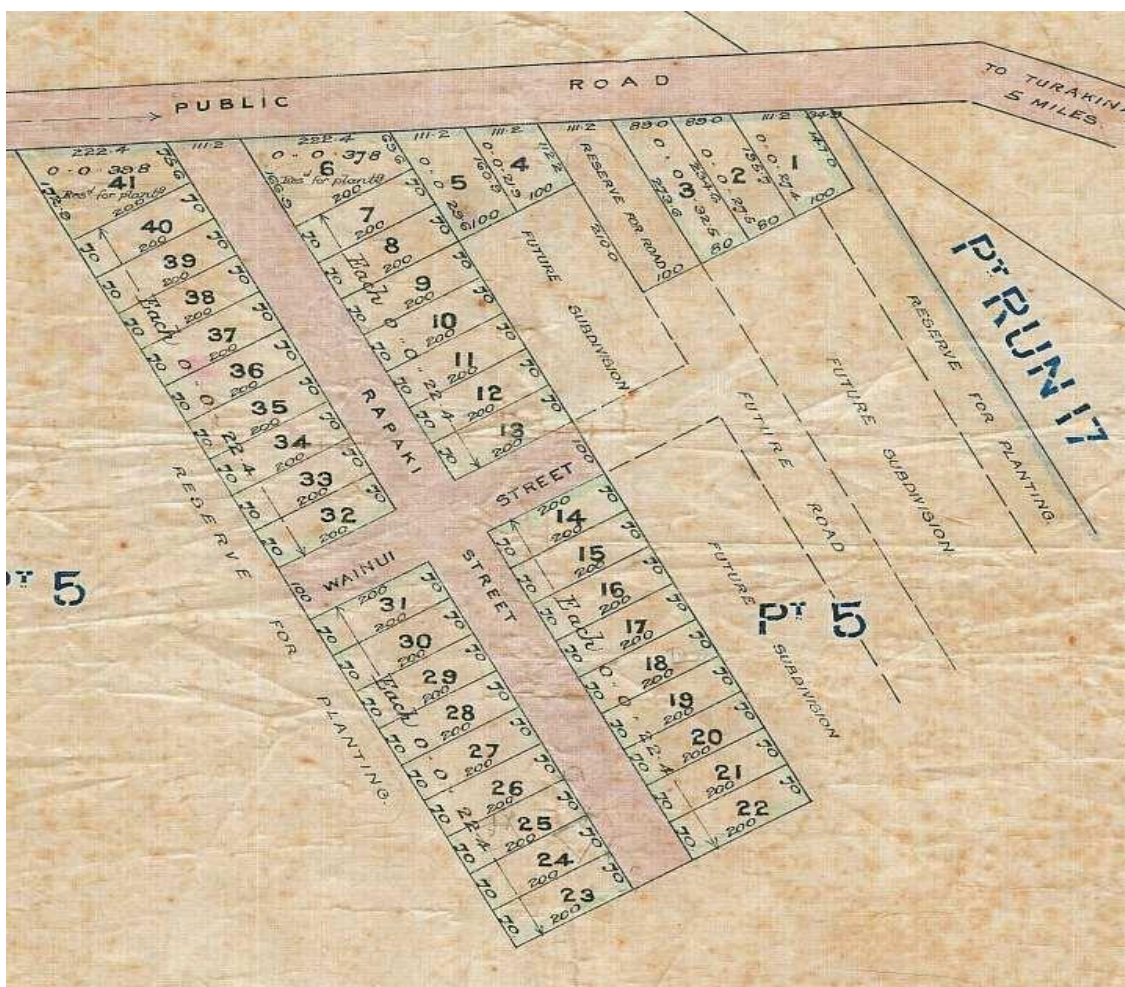
When the sections were made available in 1919, they were not freehold, but were in the Reserve and to be leased from the Crown via the Koitiata Domain Board which was a 'committee' of the Rangitikei County Council.

They were offered for lease at an *"upset annual rental of £1"* meaning that the minimum annual lease would be £1 (£1 = \$2). A news report dated 18 February 1919 indicates that the first seven sections were sold at the auction that day.

Higher rental bids for more desirable sections are evident from the annual report of the Koitiata Domain Board which states that owners had leased *"sections .... at from £1 to £1 4s 6d per annum..."*.

A news item a year later in March 1920 states that at that date a total of 11 sections had been *"... disposed of ..."*.

A Condition of Lease was, *"Lessee to take precautions to prevent sand drift ..."*. But as they were to learn, that was going to be a very difficult and drawn-out process.

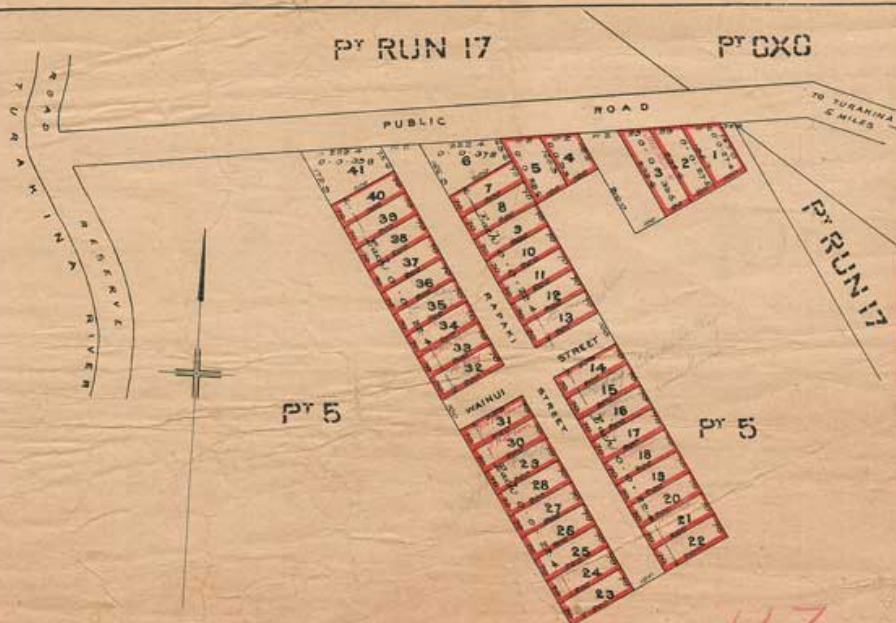

### GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

KOITIATA is situated near the mouth of the  
Turakina River and within easy distance of the  
sea and river beaches.

The sections offered for lease are situated in a nicely sheltered valley protected by low sand hills, and provide good sites for the erection of seaside cottages.

The locality has been a favourite camping-ground for a number of years for residents of the Maitlen and Turakina Districts.

Excellent fishing-grounds can be found in the neighbourhood, and there are good bathing-beaches.

The sections are mostly covered with vegetation, and can be improved to advantage by planting suitable shrubs, grasses, etc.

Access is by a public road from Turakina, about five miles distant. The road is metalled for about three miles and formed to within easy distance of the sections.

Now, vehicles can now be driven to the sections, but, owing to patches of loose sand, motor vehicles can at present only be taken to within about half a mile of the town.

### Conditions of Sale.

THE first year's rent, together with fee of £1 1s. for preparation of lease and 3s. stamp duty, to be paid on fall of hammer.

Lessee to execute lease within two months of date of sale, otherwise his interest will be liable to forfeiture.

Further conditions in respect of any of the sections offered may be announced at the sale.

### Abstract of Conditions of Lease

1. RENTAL to be paid yearly in advance.
2. Lessee to pay all rates and taxes.
3. Lessee not to assign or sublet without the consent of the Governor-General.
4. Lessee to erect within two years residence of at least two rooms to approval of the Kottah Doman Board. The Board to fix the time within which a residence is to be erected for a further period of two years.
5. Lessee to keep hallings, fences, &c. in repair and paint buildings.
6. Lessee not to take precautions to prevent rain-drift and conform to provisions of any law made by the Kottah Doman Board.
7. Lessee to leave twenty-one years. The house is assigned with value of improvements if re-erected at the expiry of the term.
