# **Getting Serviced**

When the village started, it was an un-serviced campground. The streets were just lines on a map, they didn't exist. It was just tracks in the sand, through the marram grass, low scrub, and lupins — and more sand. There was no electricity, no telephones, no streetlights, no services of any kind. And that's the way it was for almost the first fifty years.

Electricity only came as far as Tunnel Hill in 1960 and residents petitioned the Power Board, asking for them to extend the power lines. The response in 1961 was "yes, but ... and only if the 'settlers' guarantee £400 (collectively) per year." RCC took up the case and it appears that the leasehold status of the village was an issue. RCC followed it up in 1963 and finally, after 4 years of effort from residents and RCC, a connection was planned and approved Sept. 1964 and installed in 1965.

Streetlights were approved for installation by RCC in February 1965, but nothing happened. The lights were out. A "leaseholders meeting" in Aug 1978 voted against streetlights. Lights were still out. A survey in Nov. 1978 voted to have them, and in January 1979 the lights had been installed and were finally turned on.

Until 1968 the streets were gravel over sand, and sometimes under the sand. From records it appears that it was 1969/70 before all streets were sealed in the village.

A document from 1979 states that "... streets renamed ... and signs put up." We don't have any information as to what the origin is of our street names or what they mean. The different development stages had resulted in section numbering being a bit of a mishmash and in 1979 the current street number system was implemented.

The first sign of any retail commerce in the village was in September 1920, when RCC gave permission to Mr Alfred Yarrow, a baker of Turakina, to "build a dwelling-house and shop combined." This was to be on the section he leased at 25 Rapaki street, but it never happened, and Alfred Yarrow moved to Manaia in 1923. Yes, it's the same Yarrows and look at where that business is now. Imagine the smell of fresh bread wafting over the village every morning. There are anecdotal reports of a shop being operated from the premises at 22 Rapaki street, but no records have been located.

There was talk re a phone box in 1968, and it appears there were some phones connected in the village in Aug 1972. It is not known when the phone system was first installed.

Access to the internet was via the copper land-line phone system. A Wi-Fi broadband internet system was installed and became available in Koitiata in 2010.



In connection with your application some months ago for a supply of power at the Turakina beach the Board has decided that this supply will be given when funds are available to do the work providing the settlers will enter into a guarantee in respect to the cost of giving the supply.

The guarantee we require would be somewhere about £400 a year from the whole area and would need to be permanently assured. Spread over the settlers the amount is not large but it is a minimum required to cover the cost of the construction.

#### Power Supply to Turakina Seach

The information which we have in the office on the prospects of a supply to the Seach indicate that this work will coat round about £5,000. This figure is subject to verification by actual check and catiosting, if and shen the work proceeds, but the figure is sufficiently close for as to have any tentative regotiations. On this expenditure the Posen's present guarantee policy smald call for an annual guarantee of not less than E.Co. being 45 per cent on the estimate. While this amount may appear large, it. is less than MC per section on the subdivision which we understand is likely to boom, and should provide very cheap service.

It should be understood that the £550 is a minimum guarantee and not a flat-rate charge of supply. I make this point because of the number of the residents would probably use more than £10 of electricity over a season and it could be that the guarantes sould be adequately novered by normal use of electricity. This will depend entirely on the type of residences to be erected and the period of occupation.

Hossver, the estimated requirement of \$450 a year will give you assething on which to examine the possibility of accepting responsibility for the suaruntee.

The points raised in your letter are answered as

- (1) The provision of power to the settlement was taken up with the Power Board none menths ago. Polluving a request from the former Chairman of the Association the Council sent a circular to power consection to all residents and it was ascertained that thirtyrive residents now interested in connecting to power supply. An approach was then sade to the Power Board.

  A copy of the Fower Board's roply is enclosed for your information.

  It was subsequently advised by the Fower Board that the summal guarantee would probably be 2500. As the Council has no authority to make this guarantee no surface action was taken beyond advising the former Chairman of your Association of the position.
- (2) The rates from the area are not accounted for separately. They fore part of the general fuses of the County. The annual rentals from the sections are accounted for separately and must be utilised within the Domain area. The account appears each year in the published Annual Accounts of the Council. Receipts last year anounted to \$484.48.8. consisting of \$472 rentals and \$42.48.8.

  9.0.5.8. interest. Payments were \$271.8.0, the main item being still for survey fees for the new area, the belonce being for labour and machinery hire for work in the Desmin. The funds in hand at lat April 1962 were \$355.1.6.
- (3 & 4) (lighting of fires and tree planting). These natters would require to be taken up with the Council.





Notes of meeting held at Koltists 13th April, 1965.

Meeting called by Koitiate Beach Section-holders at 10 a.m. at home of Mr.Huijs Approximately 40 people present including Councillor Gordon and County Engineer. Chairman of Meeting - Mr.L.P. Anderson.

After Councillor Gordon outlined the Council's programms for metalling the 23 miles of road from the beach to the existing seel this financial year, a full discussion developed on possible improvements to the Koitieta Domain.

The following works were recommended to Council for action this year:-

The meeting favoured the erection of 30 m.p.h. signs and the Council is asked to approach Transport Department on this matter.

Rubbish Dump

The area set aside is now filled and the Council is requested to open up a new site.

Access to Sections from road

Some section holders queried whose responsibility it was to restore access after road construction.

Public Telephone

The Council is asked to approach P & T Department for information on the provision of a call box when the new Turakina Exchange is operational.

River Erosion

The main concern of the meeting appeared to centre around river erosion. The Council is asked to make a further approach to the Catchment Board for an inspection of the encroachment by the Engineers of the County Council and Catchment Board and also by representatives of the section holders. Mrs.Farr and Mr. Huddleston were appointed as representatives.

Water Supply

The meeting expressed support in principle for the establishment in future of a permanent reticulated water supply as outlined by the County Engineer.

Upgrading of Side Streets

It was agreed that no further upgrading of the side streets was required at this stage.

I have been requested by several section holders at the Koitists Domsin ( Turskins Beach) to draw your Council's strention to the state of the road from the end of the sealed portion to the beach.

At present this is in a very poor state: in several places the sand is showing through, and generally there is only a very thin coating of metal. Unless something is done before the Winter, the road will be in a bad state by then. It would appear that a good coating of metal is required over the whole length mentioned, so that it would consolidate before the wet weather comes. Er. Connors has been approached by some sectionholders and will no doubt confirm this statement of the condition of the road.

In addition to those of us who only visit the beach periodically, there are some permanent residents now, which makes it more important that the road should be in a reasonable condition.

One other point which is still esusing concern to some, is the erosion of the river just above the settlement: this was inspected about two years ago by some of your Council's officers, who at that time did not consider the position as requiring attention, but I am informed that some action may soon be needed.

The only other point I wish to make is that, some time ago I suggested that sectionholders be supplied with some kind of financial statement, but none has been forthcoming. If this is not possible, perhaps you could let me have the approximate position, and I would then be able to savise any who enquire as to the finances of the Domain Board.

The development of the Koitieta Domain for the next five years has been discussed by the Board and the section holders in the Domain settlement. The angitikei County as part of this year's works programme are reconstructing and metalling the remaining 2½ miles of gravel road giving access to the foreshore of the Domain. This work will be continued next year to include top course and seal of the road to the boundary of the housing settlement. There will then remain only ½ mile of gravel road through the township.

Development of the domain suggested:-

- 1. Top course and seal of 40 chain of main road
- Metal and form 10 chain access road on beach front
- 3. Improved access to mouth of river
- Level and grass approximately 10 ecres as camping ground and picnic ares on the Eastern side of the settlement
- 5. Tree planting
- 6. Public water supply.

During the current financial year it is proposed to:-

- 1. Seal 20 chain of the access road through the settlement
- 2. Level and grass the camping ground
- Improve access to river mouth.
